Permian Basin Fun Facts

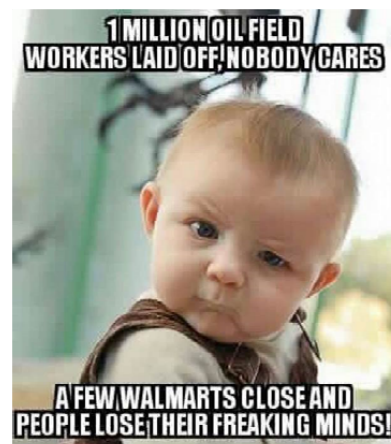
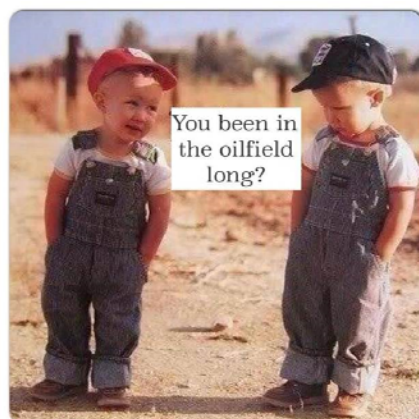
- The first major discovery of oil in West Texas was made by a man with no experience in oil -- Frank T. Pickrell. Pickrell, along with experienced driller, Carl Cromwell, successfully drilled the Santa Rita No. 1 outside of Big Lake, TX on land leased from the University of Texas. The team drilled for 646 days and on May 27, 1923, the bit hit pay-dirt just above 3,050 feet below the surface. Cromwell shut down the well when he saw gas bubbles escaping from the casing head. The driller and his tool dresser, Dee Locklin, were convinced they had a good oil well and left the site to lease surrounding mineral acreage while the discovery was yet unknown.
- The next morning, Cromwell and Locklin both heard a roaring sound outside their homes near the well. Oil, pulsing from the wellhead, would ebb and flow several times until it eventually blew over the top of the derrick. It would then drop to just a trickle and start all over again. That 12- to 14-hour process repeated itself for two weeks before the flow was brought under control. In the interim, oil filled both of the 250-barrel tanks on the location and flooded the surrounding countryside. It has been estimated that the Santa Rita #1 produced between 30 and 100 barrels of oil per day.
- The Santa Rita No. 1 was named after Saint Rita of Cascia – the patron saint of impossible causes. The original equipment was preserved by the Texas State Historical Association and was installed on the University of Texas campus in the 1950's. It is currently located within site of the Darrel K Royal – Texas Memorial Stadium. The wellbore itself was plugged in 1990 after 67 years of service.
